Basic Training for New Dads

Taught by dads, for dads. Led by volunteers, it is the only program of its kind specifically for fathers preparing to meet the challenges of fatherhood.

You make it possible for new parents to receive accredited home visitation services to help build parent confidence and create safe, nurturing home environments.

Second Step: Child Protection Unit

Partnerships with local preschools help provide children, teachers and parents with information they need to stay safe and prevent child sex abuse.

Rock Island County CASA Program

A CASA is an everyday citizen, specially trained to advocate in juvenile court for the best interests and safety of children ages 17 and younger involved in the court system as victims of abuse and neglect. CASA volunteers gather information, identify resources and work in partnership with all parties to ensure the child's needs are met.

Rock Island County AOK Network

A community collaboration formed to prioritize partnerships, the Network supports and reflects community needs to address service barriers and ensure healthy starts for children ages 0-5 in our community.

Treatment

Safe from the Start – Clinical Coaching

Our licensed therapists work with early childhood providers to promote positive social emotional development and behavioral health to help reduce the impact of mental health challenges among young children and their families.

Safe from the Start – Therapy

Using play, in combination with therapy and case management, helps children ages 0-5 begin to heal from trauma exposure and prevent future trauma from occurring.

Mississippi Valley Child Protection Center

You help give children a safe place to tell their story and begin to heal after experiencing abuse or neglect. Our staff works alongside law enforcement, prosecutors, child welfare workers, healthcare professionals, and other service providers to provide support and specialized child advocacy center services while implementing a coordinated team approach aimed at keeping children and families safe and healthy.

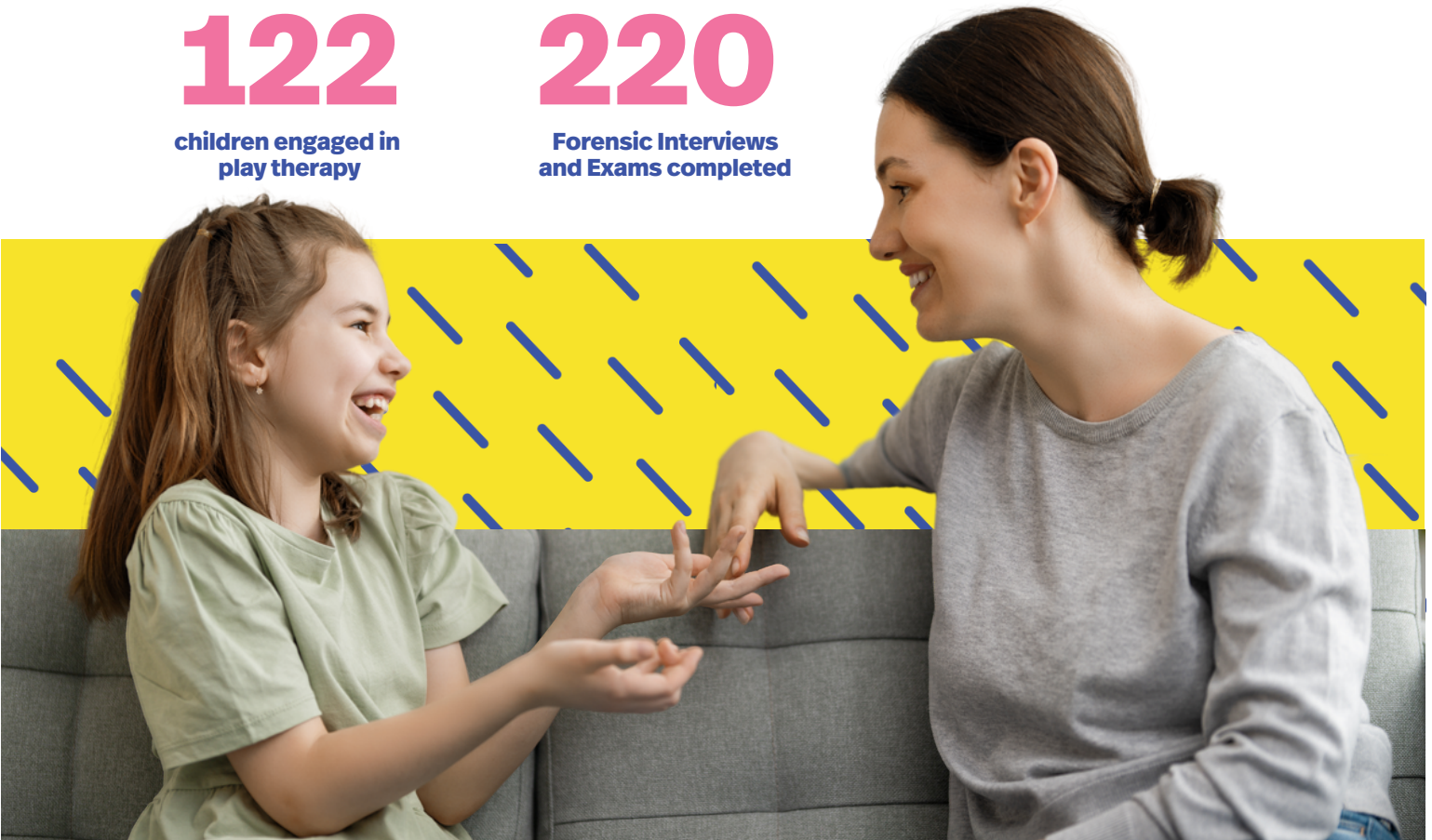

Preventing childhood trauma is the single biggest return on investment and the most effective way to improve life outcomes and strengthen communities.

\$15

Provides one pre-school student with a 15-week program that introduces the topic of child sexual abuse.



\$35

Helps a soon-to-be-father learn how to navigate his new role.

\$50

Provides a military family with an organized playgroup, increasing social supports and providing better connections into our community.

\$100

Provides one teacher with training in child abuse prevention and equips them with the resources necessary to swiftly respond to suspected abuse and neglect.

\$250

Hosts a parent support group to increase social interaction, participate in a parent-child activity and link to community resources.

\$600

Connects a child with a safe environment and a forensic interview from an expert trained in reducing the trauma experience by victims.

\$750

Connects a child in the foster care system with a trained volunteer advocate who works in partnership with the court to ensure the child's needs are met.

\$1,250

Provides one year of life changing therapy for a child who's experienced abuse.

\$2,500

Provides a family with one year of home visiting support to increase parenting confidence and nurture family relationships.

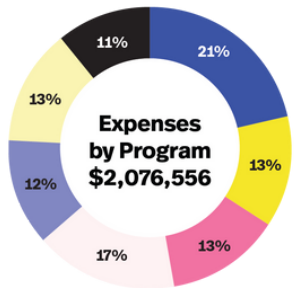
\$5,000

Provides at-risk parents with prenatal and postnatal care, birth support and vital resources to give their baby the best possible start in life.

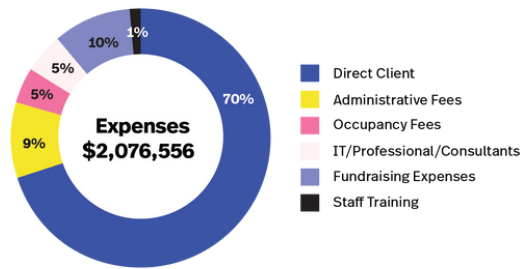
